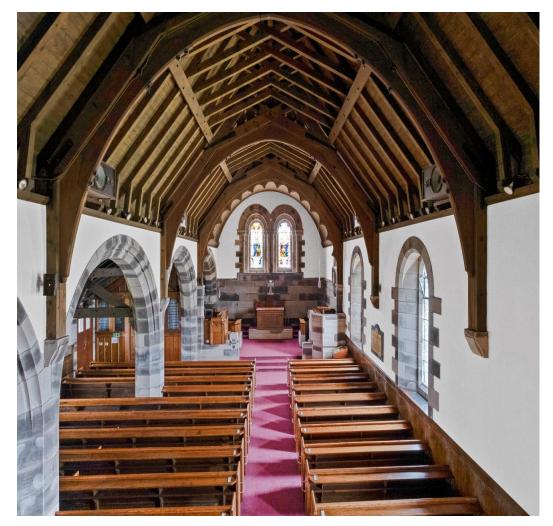
The property is connected to mains supplies of water and electricity. Drainage goes into the main public sewer.

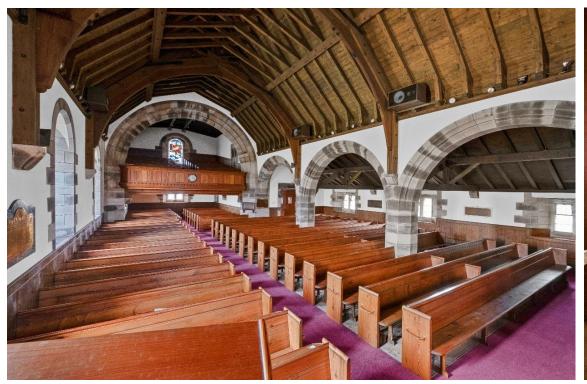


Local Area

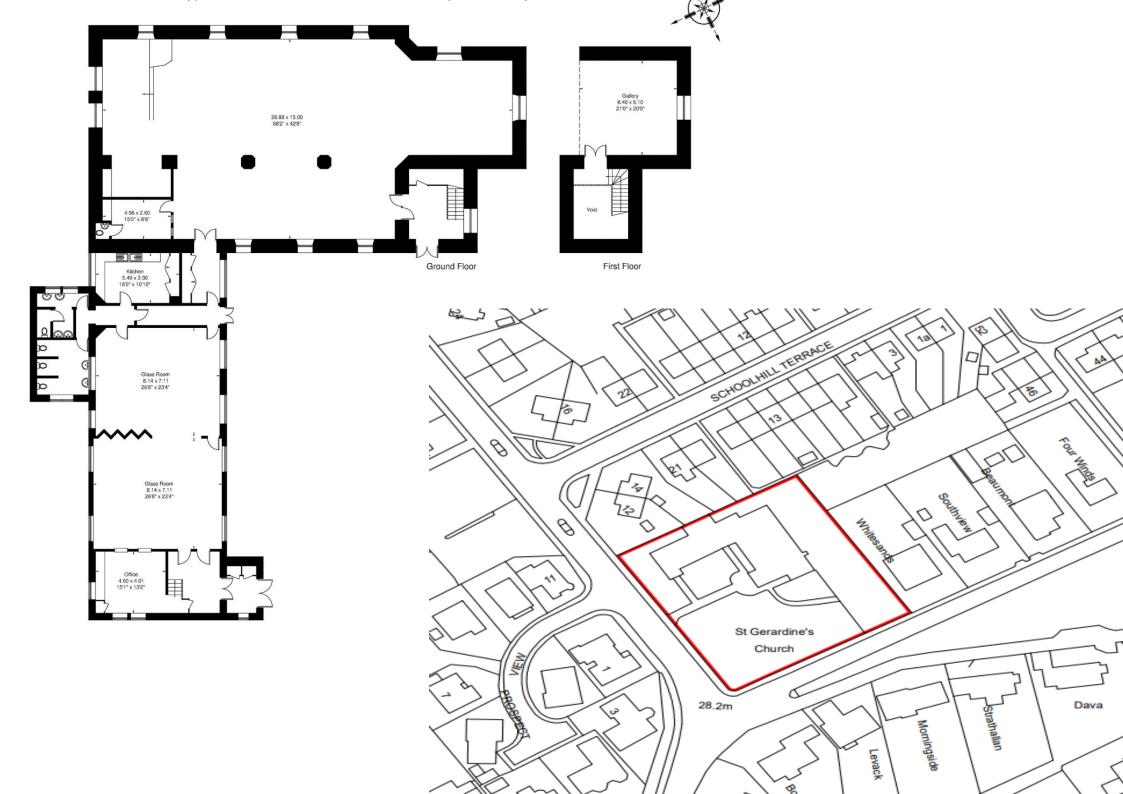
Lossiemouth is well-connected to nearby towns via bus or car.
